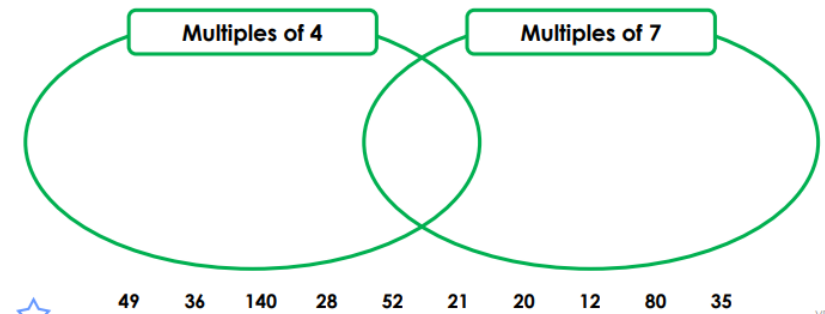

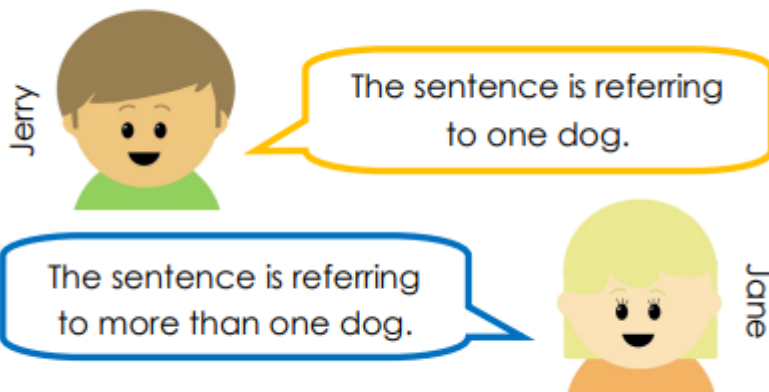
Circle the words which could be contracted using an apostrophe.
