Social Media Update

We are aware that many children are using social media when 'officially' they are too young to sign up to the sites – we know because some of them have told us. Lots of them say that Mums and Dads have signed them up – sometimes years ago. There's nothing illegal in that, but please keep in mind that if you signed your 8 year old up to Facebook five years ago, saying they were 13 years old – they now appear as an 18 year old on the site.

If an adult tries to groom your now 13 year old via social media, they will be able to argue that they thought they were talking to another adult. Remember to update their details, check their privacy settings, and talk to them about which pictures they use for their profile, so they're safe online. Thank you.

Weekly Attendance Figures



Diarrhoea & Vomiting Bug

Please remember that if your child has the diarrhoea and vomiting bug they need be clear from the bug for 48 hours before returning to school. This is guidance from the NHS that we are required to follow.

The school has received a number of concerns from parents regarding the current sickness and diarrhoea bug that is going around the school. Our cleaners have been carrying out an extra deep clean, paying particular attention to door handles and taps. All children wash their hands before leaving their classrooms at lunchtime and sanitise their hands before entering the lunch hall. Particular attention has been paid to ensuring the children wash their hands properly.

We urge parents to strictly abide by the 48 hour rule if their child has had this bug in order to reduce the risk of spreading it to other children and staff. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.
