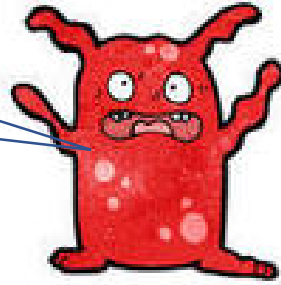


YEAR 4 HOMEWORK
