


Father Christmas Visits Kea School

ParentPay - our new online payment service for School Dinner Money

We are pleased to announce that next term (February 2019) the kitchen will be accepting payments online for dinner money. Using a secure website called ParentPay you will be able to pay online using your credit or debit card or make cash payments at PayPoint stores. This system will enable you to book your child's lunch option and make payment at the same time.

When we move to this system, the kitchen will no longer be able to accept cash or cheque payments.


