Use the blank cards. Write your own sentences linked to the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and place them onto the correct beanstalks.

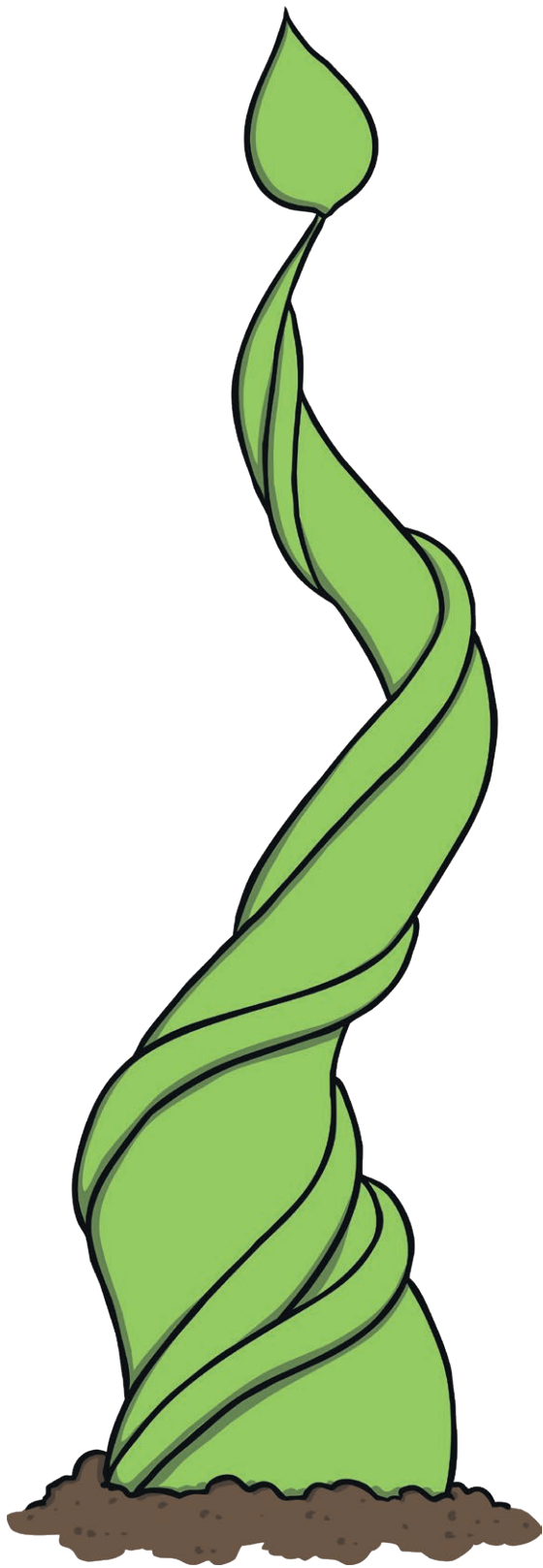

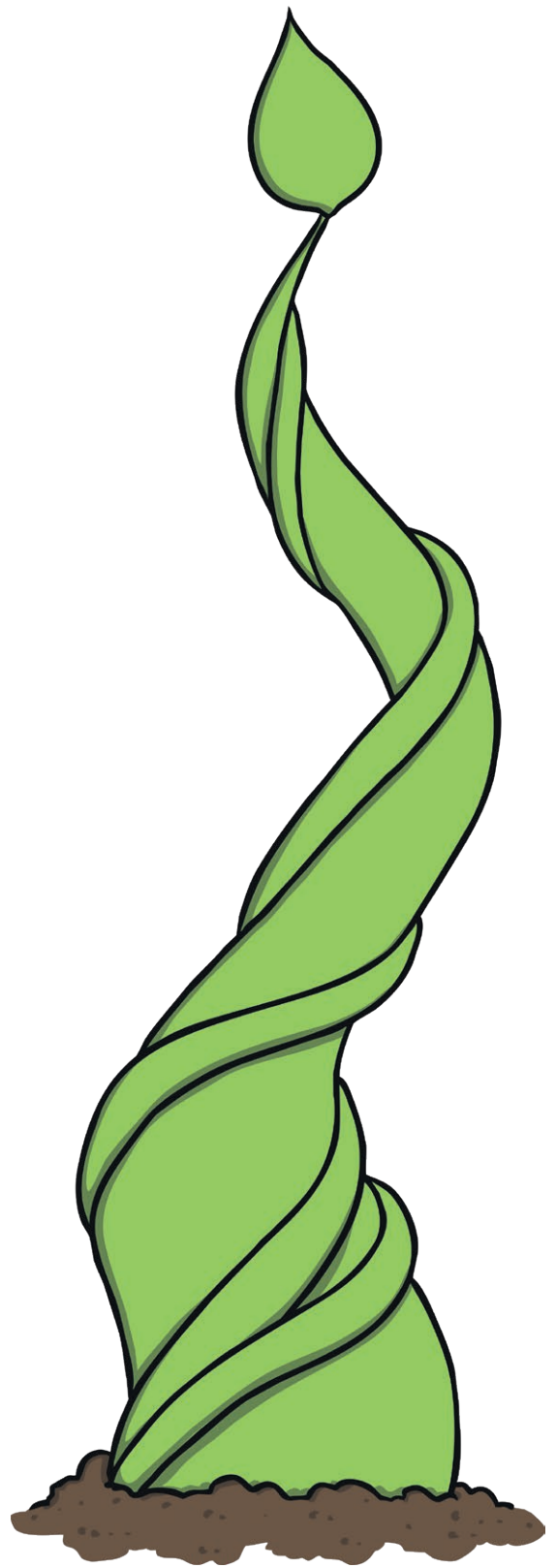

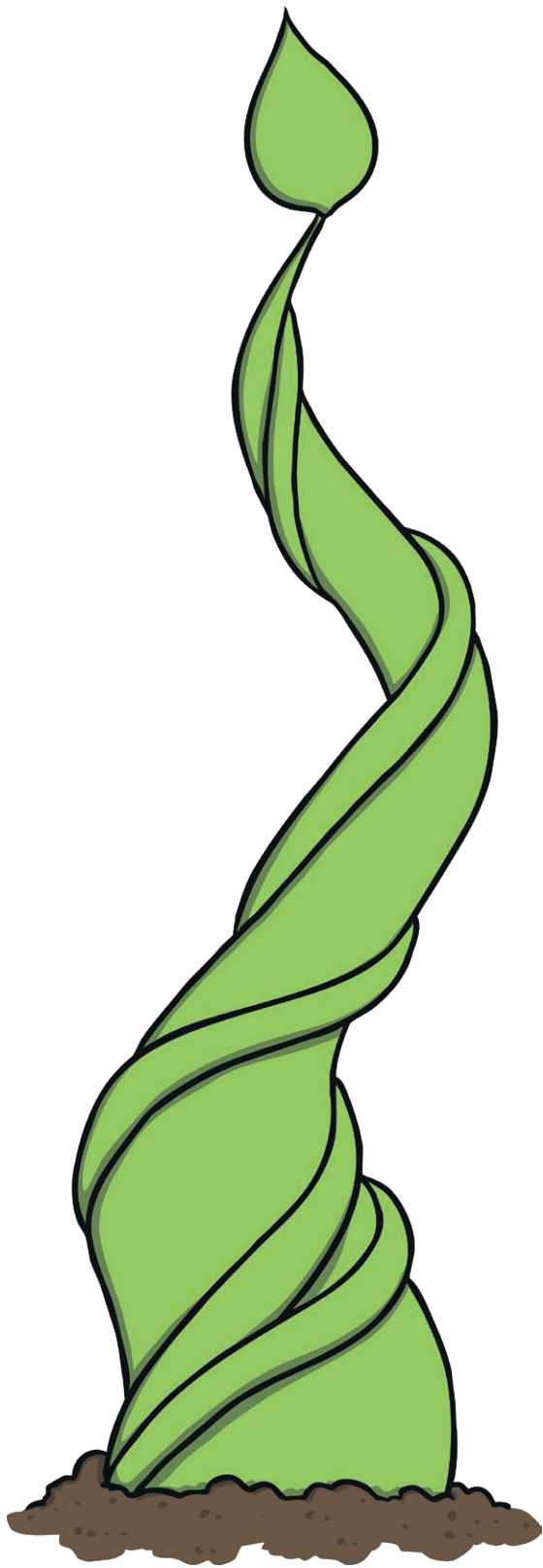
Statements are sentences which tell you something. They end in a full stop.

Jack had a cow called Daisy.



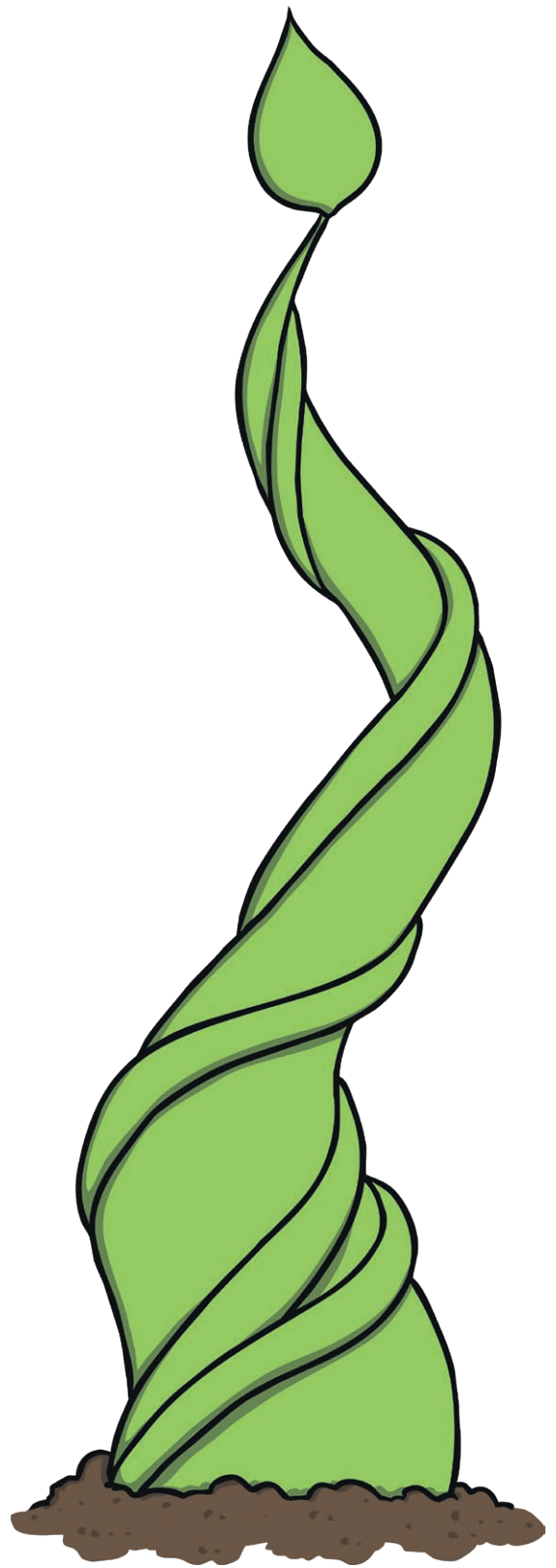
Questions are sentences that ask something. They end in a question mark.

Who did Jack meet on his way to the market?



Exclamation Sentences begin with 'what' or 'how'. They are full sentences, include a verb and end with an exclamation mark.

What a gigantic beanstalk it was!



Commands are sentences which tell you to do something. They contain imperative verbs (bossy words).

Hold on tight, Jack. !
