



This term Year I are writing poetry. We have started by finding adjectives to describe nouns. Please read our "Firework " poems and look out for more poetry on the Year I website page.








#### Year 5—Fun-tastic Filtering!

As part of our work on changing materials during science, we have started to look at filtering. It was good to remind ourselves that like the Victorians over a hundred years ago, there are still many people in the world who do not have access to clean drinking water. We looked at a water filtering plant video about how our water is cleaned and purified in the U.K, ready for drinking, and then put this knowledge to good use by planning how we would clean dirty water ourselves. We had step-by-step guides and filtering systems made from sieves, cotton wool, filter paper and even our class marbles! Here were our results- we were pretty impressed with ourselves- what do you think?

# Year 3 and 4 Swimming Update: I and 7 November

Lou's group: Are continuing to build their confidence in the water. Skills and games have been adapted to encourage them to take a breath and go under water. We had a go in the big pool, but some of us refer the shallower water. Skills have included: push gliding



without kicking, faces in the water and woggles to give support to our shoulders, so we do not feel as though we are sinking. Mrs Bushell has been encouraging bubbles, if you can avoid adding Bubble Bath and practise making your own in the bath at home, that would be marvellous!

Faye's Y3 group: They have been focussing on their breathing intervals during front crawl and built up some good stamina. This group even had a go at swimming lengths. Faye was so pleased she thinks we will try again in a few weeks.

Faye's Y4 group: Our streamline swimming was tested during this fortnight with some 25m trials. They are well on their way. Floats are still being used to practise individual arms, then legs only for the part-whole-part drills to ensure their best technique. Everyone managed to swim from the deep end. Some of them were sensible and rotated (mid-swim) on to their backs to catch their breaths. Super effort!

Trish's Y3 group: Their focus moved away from backstroke and looked at breastroke legs. This developed so well that they had the opportunity to take the plunge in the deep end and try 25m. Their stamina focus for this fortnight was front crawl legs. When I asked how they were they all called 'tied'! Keep up the hard work!

Trish's Y4 group: Prior learning was essential for this master class. They have been honing their skills to develop stamina for all three strokes and they were tested on their lengths. All of the children can swim 25m, so it was repetition, repetition, repetition. It was wonderful to see them so enthusiastic about their swimming. It is hard to maintain defined the three points of technique for breaststroke legs: bend-star-pencil, once your legs get tired. Well done all of you!




Many families attended the beach






#### **Well Done Max**
