# Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator (SENCO)

Mrs Perman is taking over the role of SENCO from Miss Warren. She will be attending training for the National Professional Qualification for SENCOs this year as well as other specialist training to support her with this role. The main areas of leadership in SEN:

Supporting the identification of children with special educational needs in the school,

Coordinating provision for children with SEN,

Tracking and monitoring the progress of children with SEN,

Ensuring that the school keeps the records of all pupils with SEN up to date,

Supporting colleagues in ensuring that they are equipped to meet the needs of children with SEN, Liaising with parents of children with SEN,

Liaising with other providers, educational psychologist and external agencies.

Throughout the autumn term and subsequently when necessarily, Miss Warren will be working closely with Mrs Perman to ensure smooth transition and to ensure that the needs of all children are met.
