




Remembrance Day Service

Lantern Workshop

On Wednesday the 14 of November, Year 5 made dove lanterns for the City of lights parade, which will take place on 21 November in Truro centre. Different schools have been given the opportunity to make willow lanterns, which will illuminate the darkness of the Cornish night sky, like no living thing has ever seen. Jill, who was the artist working with us, said "I enjoy making them with schools."

To make the frame we used willow and masking tape. First we got a couple of willow sticks and twisted them together, then put some masking tape on both ends; we made 6 of them. Next we made 2 circles out of 1 willow stick per circle. After that we made 2 tear drops that are representing the wings. We stuck a couple tear drops to 1 of the circles together. Then we stuck the second circle inside the 2 tear drops to make the body and the wings. Next we made the beak. To make the beak we got one stick of willow and make another side of the cross. Some of us made the beak 3D but some not. Katelyn said "I really enjoyed it because it was messy."

The parents said their favourite part was seeing the teamwork from the children. At the start Mrs D said she didn't want all the lanterns to be the same as each other as we are unique and special. Bronnen was frightened when she saw the tub of glue because she hates to get sticky hands, however she overcame her fears and made a beautiful, gluey and shining lantern.
