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Mr Miles's interview on Coronavirus

We asked some questions to our y6 teacher Mr Miles on what his thoughts are on the current Covid 19 crisis. He gave us some answers and here they are! Recipe – Coffee and cookies cupcakes

Ingredients:

12 cream filled biscuits (ie: Oreos)
2 eggs
110g of soft butter
55g of caster sugar
55g of light brown sugar
110g of self-raising flour
1tsp of baking powder
4tsp of instant coffee

Heat the oven to 180°C and place 12 cupcake cases in a bun tin. Pop a biscuit into the bottom of each case. Ask an adult to dissolve the coffee in 120ml of boiling water and set aside to cool. Put the eggs, sugar, flour, baking powder and butter into a bowl and beat together until you have a soft cake batter. Now stir in 2tbsp of your cooled coffee. Carefully fill the cases with batter, hiding your cookie surprise. Bake for 15-18 minutes until golden and springy to touch. Leave to cool completely.

To decorate:

120g of softened butter
225g of icing sugar
1tbsp of coffee mix
Cocoa powder to dust
Walnut halves (optional)

Mix the sugar and butter together until you get a soft icing. Now mix in the coffee and stir to get a thick glaze. Dip the cupcakes into the glaze to evenly cover the tops. Don't put on too much or it will drip down the sides. Dust the tops with a sprinkle of cocoa and add a walnut half. Leave for 15 minutes to let the glaze set. Then they're ready to eat.

After we had finished using the oil pastels, we moved onto the watercolour wash, which was our sea, we used several shades of blue and mixed others colours to get the look we wanted.

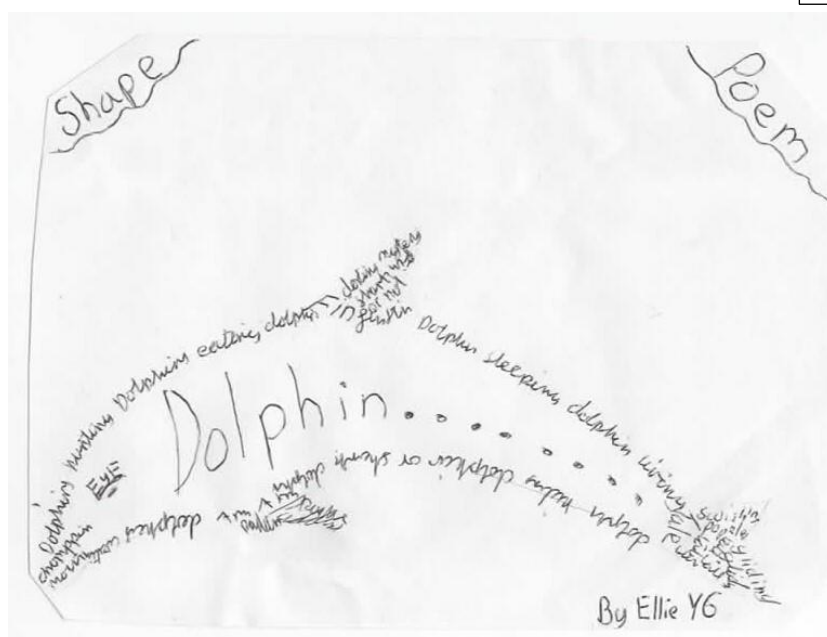
