Year 6 Cathedral Visit

On Monday this week, Year 6 visited Truro Cathedral as part of the Humanities topic Our Parish...Our Town. We had a guided tour led by Kirsten, and found out lots of information about the history of the cathedral and why it is so important to Truro.

We saw the main areas that are open to the public, then got to see the crypt downstairs and found out why it's not underground as you would expect. Ask a Year 6 why! As part of our Winter Festival topic, on Friday 3 November children are invited to come to school wearing sparkly or white clothes. On the afternoon of this day they will be sharing work they have been doing during the week and taking part in a light festival.

Attendance

As you are aware, the government set strict attendance figures for schools. The local authority target for attendance is at least 96.4% Headteachers are expected to work closely with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) to monitor low attendance (below 95%) and particularly to follow up persistent absence (below 90%). After half term, letters will be issued for children who's attendance has been lower than 95% in the first half term. We are aware however, that some children have been off for three or four days this term due to illness which is unavoidable. However, if this type of pattern of attendance continues throughout the whole year, this will have a negative impact on the child's attainment, progress and social wellbeing. Rita Rowson, our new EWO will be making appointments later this term to meet with parents of children with particularly low attendance.
