- 1. Development plan Mrs Green took me through the school development plan in regard to maths

Power Maths, a textbook and workbook series which delivers the mastery approach, is used to complement this SOL and helping teachers to plan lessons

- 3. Calculation methods We discussed how understanding of key number concepts is developed and the written methods that are used to support calculation.
- 4. Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRFs) These have been designed to support the development of the mental skills which are the foundation of any written or formal method in maths and to help develop pupils' fluency in maths. They will be introduced at the start of the summer term.
- 5. Ofsted

This was encouraging. We discussed the recommendations and how these will be addressed.

6. Lesson observations

Mrs Green had recently observed a maths class in each year group and shared her findings with me.

7. Looking at pupils' books

Mrs Green took me to three classes (years 1, 3 and 6) to look at a small selection of pupils' maths exercise books. We looked at presentation, calculation methods and marking.

8. Junior Maths Challenge

I told Mrs Green about this challenge which consists of a lively, intriguing multiple choice question paper designed to stimulate mathematical problem solving and aimed at pupils in year 8 and below.
