Message from Mrs Hunkin

It has been great this week to welcome new foundation pupils who will be joining us in September. Pupils have been invited to school in very small groups to carry out an activity in the orchard followed by a story. Several of the children were extremely excited to be in school and they are looking forward to another visit next week. Mrs Harvey and Mrs Marley were really pleased that the visits went so well and felt they had a far better chance to talk to all the children than in the past when all of the children came in together. For the past two years, Y6 pupils have each been allocated a YF 'buddy'. Throughout the year, opportunities are provided for the two year groups to spend time together, sharing books and playing games. In the past week Y5 pupils have been writing lovely welcome letters to their new buddies—these will be posted to their houses during the summer holidays.

We have been working hard at timetabling for the autumn term – something far more complicated than normal. We will be expecting all children back in September, but the government guidance recommends that we avoid too much cross over between different classes of children and staff. I am finalising details which I will publish before the end of term.

The school will not be open during the holidays and teachers will not be setting weekly learning plans. However, we will keep all the learning resources on the website for children and families who want to keep some learning ticking over during the summer.


Bubble 5—Year 6

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Bubble 4 - Year F and I




Once again Bubble 4 have been busy working together. We have been finding numbers more than and less than a given number and Year I have been counting money.


