#### **Diarrhoea & Vomiting Bug**

Please remember that if your child has the diarrhoea and vomiting bug they need be clear from the bug for 48 hours before returning to school. This is guidance from the NHS that we are required to follow. The school has received a number of concerns from parents regarding the current sickness and diarrhoea bug that is going around the school. Our cleaners have been carrying out an extra deep clean, paying particular attention to door handles and taps. All children wash their hands before leaving their classrooms at lunchtime and sanitise their hands before entering the lunch hall. Particular attention has been paid to ensuring the children wash their hands properly.

We urge parents to strictly abide by the 48 hour rule if their child has had this bug in order to reduce the risk of spreading it to other children and staff. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

## Comic Relief - Red Nose Day Events - 24 March


This year the School Council are organising different events to help raise money for Comic Relief, which will be taking place on Friday 24 March.


