## **Truro Museum Trip**

This week, children from KS2 visited the Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro to learn more about the Romans. They were able to find out more about the Romans by looking at Roman artefacts in the museum and discussing their uses. Children also learnt about Roman lamps and were able to create their own version of a Roman lamp. Thank you to Kea School Friends who kindly paid for the coach hire, therefore reducing the cost of the trip to parents.

### **SATS Tests**

Last week, parents of children in Y2 and 6 were issued with information published by the government about end of Key Stage tests. Year 6 tests need to be carried out under strict test conditions and on a specific day. These are sent off to be externally marked and results are not published until July. We work hard to minimise stress for the children.


The year 2 tests however, only form part of the overall judgement of a child's attainment. Teacher assessment, based on ongoing work in class and regular informal assessments which are carried out in class are far more important than the results of any test.

Although we are expected to administer the tests, they are delivered on a much less formal basis than Y6 tests, and can be carried out as a whole class, in small groups or on an individual one to one basis. We keep them low profile and, where possible, part of a normal maths or english lesson. The majority of children do not realise they are doing a test.

## X-Box, Play Station and Computer Games

We are writing with regard to various computer games such as 'Clash of Clans' and 'Call of Duty' that children play at home on x-boxes and play stations.


Whilst it is not up to the school to dictate what children do at home, we are concerned that some of these games are completely unsuitable for young children. A large number of games that children discuss with their friends in school are rated 15 or 18 and feature gratuitous violence and obscene language. Other games enable one person to control the game (for example who can play and what they have to contribute). There have been a number of recent incidents in which these games, which are being played at home, have had adverse effects on relationships in the classroom and playground and ultimately affected the children's work.

We ask parents and carers to be very vigilant when purchasing and allowing children to play computer and online games. Please ensure you monitor your children's use of these games.

### **School Book**

A sample copy of our book, "Cousin Jacks, The Cornish Miners" has arrived!

The book contains our children's stories, poems, letters, instructions and diary entries about Cornish Mining and the "Cousin Jacks". It is made up of a piece of writing by **every child** in the school, either as an individual piece completed in class, or as part of a group composition written on our "Big Write" day.



We are very proud of all the hard work the children have put into their book and we hope you enjoy reading it as much as we have. It will be a wonderful keepsake and a unique gift for family and friends. Our book costs £7.99 to buy, which covers the publication costs and helps us to raise funds for new books for our school library. A letter was sent home to each family on Wednesday with information on how to order a copy.

## **Eden Food Payment Schemes**

A number of parents have expressed concerns that Eden Foods are no longer taking online payments. Eden Foods terminated their contract with 'My Eden' payment system recently and looked for various payment options. Unfortunately, all the systems they looked at meant that every single family had to pay online. There has not been an option for the kitchen to have mixed payment systems (i.e. some parents paying online and others paying by cheque or cash). As not every parent is happy to pay online, Eden Foods have reluctantly moved back to cash and cheque payments only. We have spoken to PFI, who oversee all catering contracts and they will look into the matter.
