Governor observations and comments

The School Council met on Tuesday lunchtime and the primary focus of the meeting was the school plans for Comic Relief.

The Meeting was well attended and began promptly. The children were focused and engaged and were aware of the topic for discussion. One of the year 6 pupils requested to present an idea to the School Council that she had become aware of and thought that following Comic Relief it would be a good thing for the School Council to focus on.
