#### **The Great Truro High Bake Off**

Could your child be the next Mary Berry or Paul Hollywood? Do we have any budding junior masterchefs waiting to reveal their culinary expertise? Truro High School is launching a new competition to find Cornwall's top junior baker. The contest is open to girls and boys from Years 5 and 6 to take part.

Round one will take place at Kea School and competitors are invited to bring in a dozen homemade biscuits for judging by a panel of judges from Truro High School on Monday 29 February. Judging is anonymous so can children's names be put on the bottom of your entry (the container or plate you bring your biscuits in/on) so names are not visible to the judges.

The winners from each school will be invited to attend the semi-finals at Truro High School in early March where they, assisted by a grown-up helper, will be asked to bake half a dozen flavoured muffins of their choice.

The last round will be the Grand Final at Truro High School on Monday 21 March when their panel of young chefs will take on that age-old classic, the Victoria Sponge.

The winning school will be invited to bring a class of children to Truro High for a Food Experience Cookery Workshop during the Summer Term. Truro High School last year won a Good Schools Guide gold award for its Home Economics and our food teachers promise a fun-filled day. The winning chef will also walk away with their own prize in the form of a voucher to attend a Rick Stein Children's Cookery Course on April 7 in Padstow. All those taking part will receive a certificate and we hope you will join us in encouraging a new generation of young chefs and bakers to show off their kitchen skills.
