We asked:


- Why was Grace Darling a hero? •



One of the biggest causes of the spread of sickness and diarrhoea is children coming back to school too early after they have been ill. If your child is unwell with either sickness or diarrhoea please keep them off school for a full 48 hours after their last episode of sickness or diarrhoea – even if they seem completely well in themselves.
