# **British Science Week**

The school has enjoyed participating in many different activities as part of British Science Week. On Thursday and Friday, we welcomed the Spacelab Mobile Planetarium. All children got to visit it to experience the solar system, stars and other space wonders. There was certainly much awe and wonder within the dome. On Thursday, Year 3 were visited by Y5 pupils from Tregolls school. They have also been learning about Space in their Tim Peake topic. Their Y5's brought a variety of different experiments and investigations to help our children learn more and understand Space. One investigation involved using gloves to construct a lego model, showing how hard it is for astronauts to work with their hands inside a spacesuit. All classes at Kea were set science themed homework and there was much awe and wonder as children shared their science with the rest of the class. Homework included children finding facts about scientists, sharing of science books, carrying out an investigation or bringing in an experiment. On Wednesday, the children had a science assembly where we learnt about famous scientists and their inventions or theories. We made eggs float, cleaned dirty coins and put skewers through balloons without them popping. All in all, a very science themed week at Kea!
