
Year I Houses

In Year I we are learning about houses from a long time ago. We used pictures and models to find out about some of the first houses built. We learned that these houses were made of stone, not bricks and the roofs were made of straw, called "thatch". These houses were called "round houses".

We made our own roundhouses and thought about 2D and 3D shapes at the same time. We rolled a rectangular piece of paper into a cylinder shape and circular piece of paper into a cone shape.
















Year 4 Examine Victorian Artefacts

A £15 Book Token is awarded to the school with most points in each age section.


A Cup is awarded to the Best Overall Exhibit.
