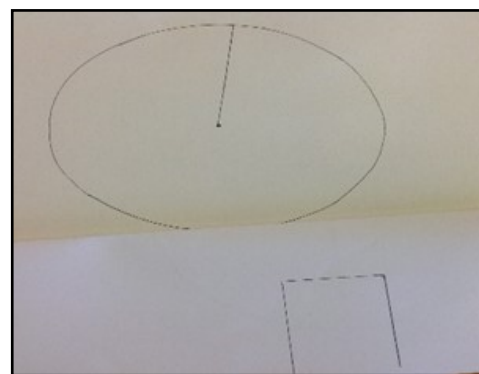
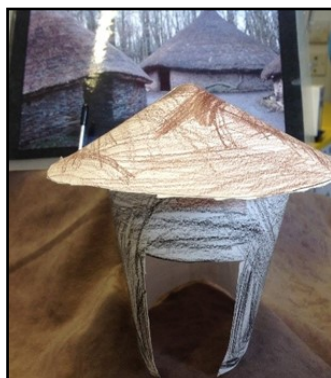




## Year 1 Houses

In Year 1 we are learning about houses from a long time ago. We used pictures and models to find out about some of the first houses built. We learned that these houses were made of stone, not bricks and the roofs were made of straw, called "thatch". These houses were called "round houses".

We made our own roundhouses and thought about 2D and 3D shapes at the same time. We rolled a rectangular piece of paper into a cylinder shape and circular piece of paper into a cone shape.



## Year 4 Examine Victorian Artefacts

In Year 4, we have been very lucky to examine different artefacts from the Victorian Era! We were all very careful when handling them as they were very old! Some of the artefacts that we looked at included a feather quill, wooden pegs, a pastry cutter made out of bone and a copper kettle! Everyone was interested to learn about how each item was used during the Victorian era. Miss Reeve was very impressed as Year 4 were very respectful with the artefacts.

Some of the children will be swimming in the small pool, whilst the rest will be in the larger pool. Using width and lane dividers, the position of groups will change according to the skills they will be focusing on. Some swimmers will be in the shallow end and some will venture into deeper water.

We thoroughly enjoyed our time in the pool and we are already looking forward to next week!

Please ensure your child has a swim hat because we only have a few spare and the children must wear one to participate in their lesson. If your child is able to bring goggles this does help build confidence to have their face in the water. This will support the correct body position, which in turn improves stroke fluidity.

(NB: We were told last year that there are some funding options for prescription goggles. Please ask your family optician.)
