	Monday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This week will be reading a new story called “Mrs Armitage On Wheels” by Quentin Blake. You can listen to the story at any time today and retell it someone in your family.</li> <li>In our recorded lesson, we will learn how to use <b>and</b> to make our sentences longer and join our ideas together. We will be using this skill in our writing during the week.</li> </ul>
	Tuesday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Today we are going to read our Mrs Armitage On Wheels story using the link <a href="#">Mrs Armitage on wheels by Quentin Blake - YouTube</a></li> <li>Turn the sound down and try to retell the story as the story teller, using the pictures as prompts.</li> <li>You will be writing sentences using the repeating pattern in the story.  <b>Best handwriting</b>  <b>Capital letter and a full stop</b>  <b>RED words and Fred Talk</b> </li> </ul>
	Wednesday,	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Today we are going to improve our sentences from yesterday by adding adjectives eg <i>What this bike needs is an ice cream maker</i> will become <i>What this bike needs is an <b>amazing, double coned</b> ice cream maker.</i>  <b>Best handwriting</b>  <b>Capital letter and a full stop</b>  <b>RED words and Fred Talk</b> </li> </ul>
	Thursday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Today we are going to use <b>and</b> to link some of our ideas in our sentences. We looked at using <b>and</b> in a sentence on Monday so you can revisit that lesson if you need to.</li> <li>Now look at today’s video lesson to use <b>and</b> in your “Mrs Armitage” sentences  <b>Best handwriting</b>  <b>Capital letter and a full stop</b>  <b>RED words and Fred Talk</b> </li> </ul>
