Dear Parents and Carers

## Information about all pupils returning to school on Monday 8 March.

We are looking forward to welcoming all pupils back to school next week and have been reviewing our systems to ensure everyone's safety. Much of this information is similar to that which was in place in the autumn term. However, please note that timings for all classes have changed slightly. We will review this once term has started, and will amend timings if necessary.

## Pupil Groups

In line with all the government guidance, we have risk-assessed our provision. Children will work in normal sized class groups. However, our timetable has been adapted to reduce the number of different groups / classes that any adult works with over the course of the week.

## Classes, rooms and timings

In order to manage the number of pupils in school and their parents bringing them to school as safely as we can, school start and end times will be staggered. They will be as follows:

Y5	9.05am – 3.30pm	Mrs Drzymala (M, T, W, T) Mrs Samuels (F)	Drop off by disabled parking Main door to Victorian building Pick up by disabled parking area
Y6	8.55am – 3.20pm	Mr Miles	Drop off by disabled parking Back door to Victorian building Pick up by disabled parking area



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## **Wraparound Care (before and after school provision) / School clubs**

Kea Pre-school are resuming breakfast and after school clubs. We will not be running after school clubs before the Easter holidays.

## **Uniform / PE kit**

Children are expected to wear full school uniform. There is no requirement to wear clean clothes every day or to wash uniform more often than normal.

We are ventilating all classrooms – the windows are open all day, so please ensure your child has sufficient warm clothes to wear during the day.

Children may wear PE kit for the whole day on their PE days.

## **Hygiene**

Children will all be expected to wash their hands once they have entered school as well as on exit. They will also be washing their hands at regular intervals during the day. Hand wash and hand sanitiser is available in every classroom.

PPE will be worn by staff only for providing intimate care and to support children who are ill.

## **Toilets**

Each group will have certain toilets allocated to them – to reduce the number of children using them throughout the day. All toilets will be cleaned at lunchtime each day as well as after school.

## **Playtimes**

Playtimes will be timetabled on a rota basis. Where more than one class are outside at one time, each class will be allocated a certain play area. We are fortunate to have a number of outside spaces in our school and we will make the most of them as much as we can.

The free fruit scheme will be in place this term. You are welcome to provide your child with a healthy snack (fruit, plain biscuit, piece of cheese). **No nuts or products containing sesame please as we have a number of children with severe allergies.**

## **Lunches**

Lunches will be timetabled on a rota basis to reduce the number of children in the hall at any time. All lunches will be eaten in the hall.

All lunches will need to be ordered and paid for (if you pay for lunches) on Parent Pay.

## **Contact with the School**

In order to reduce the number of adults in the school, parents will not be invited to enter the school building except in exceptional circumstances. As always, you can get messages to your child's class teachers via the office by telephone or e-mail ([secretary@kea.cornwall.sch.uk](mailto:secretary@kea.cornwall.sch.uk)) and if you wish to speak to the class teacher, we can organise this for you at a time convenient for both parties. We would appreciate your support in only having one adult dropping off or collecting your child at this time. If you need to bring a younger child/ren at the same time, please ensure they are strapped in a buggy or are holding on to you – and that they don't run around the playground.



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## **Attendance**

The government are expecting that all children will return to school full time from 8 March. We will be taking registers daily and the school will be required to monitor attendance in the usual way.

## **What happens if someone gets ill?**

If a child or an adult within a class gets ill with Covid-19 symptoms, we will seek advice from the NHS. It may well be that if someone tests positive with Covid-19 then the entire class will need to self-isolate. We will keep you informed with any updates on this if and when the situation arises.
