Message from Mrs Hunkin

It has been lovely having larger numbers of children back in school for the past three weeks. Pupils are getting used to being in smaller bubbles (rather than whole classes of 30), seeing fewer school staff than usual, having lunch in their classrooms and not playing with anyone outside their bubble. In every group, pupils are working hard and everywhere feels really calm. Thanks to those of you who are still supporting your children with home learning. I can imagine how hard it is for them (and you), that they are not able to come back to school yet.

Mrs Olive and Mrs Green have both requested to move to part time working from September - governors have agreed this. Mrs Drzymala (Mrs D) is not yet sure when she will be returning from maternity leave – possibly January, but maybe a little earlier. I am delighted that Mrs Samuels will be teaching Y5 until she returns. She is a very strong and experienced teacher who has worked a number of days at Kea as supply teacher in the past year. I am also delighted that Mrs Marley will be re-joining the staff team in YF to cover some of Mrs Walker's maternity leave. Staffing will be as follows:

We are still waiting for further guidance from the government about September. It is clear that they intend all primary pupils to return to school full time - but we are waiting to hear more details. For instance, we do not yet know if adults will be able to work with different groups throughout the week, whether classes will be able to mix with others at break/lunch times, whether they will be able to move about the school more freely and use different rooms (hall/ ICT suite), whether it will be ok for parents to gather together outside classrooms at the start/end of the day - or whether we'll still need to have staggered start/end times. I will also be liaising with Kea Preschool to find out whether they will be able to provide breakfast and after school clubs. We will let you know as soon as we know more.


enjoyed getting to know each other better this week through our fun "social distancing" games.

We are doing lots of work around settling the children back into school, as well as preparing the children for their transition to secondary school.


It has been fantastic seeing so many Year 6s back at school, being so positive and supportive of each other and getting on with things as normal. They are an amazing group of children.


