Advice and ideas

Maths

Provide a range of 3D shapes. Encourage children to find all the cubes and cones and describe them. If observing, ask children to name some of the other 3D shapes.

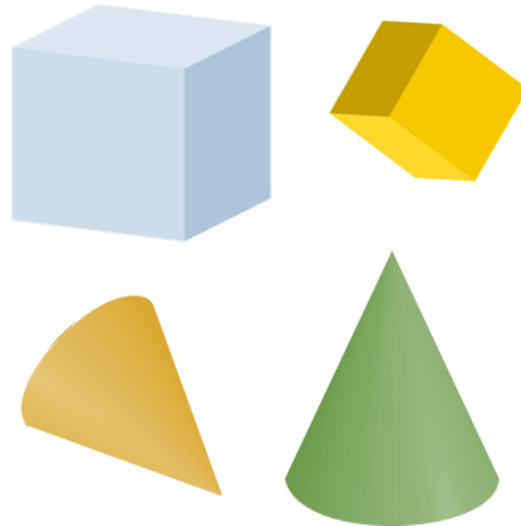
Writing

Provide a selection of 3D shapes, a word bank of 3D shape names, a whiteboard and pen. Ask children to select a 3D shape and write its name on the whiteboard using the word bank.

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Construction

Provide a range of 3D shapes for children and encourage them to build their tower in different ways. Ask children which shapes work best in the tower and if any shapes do not stack properly.

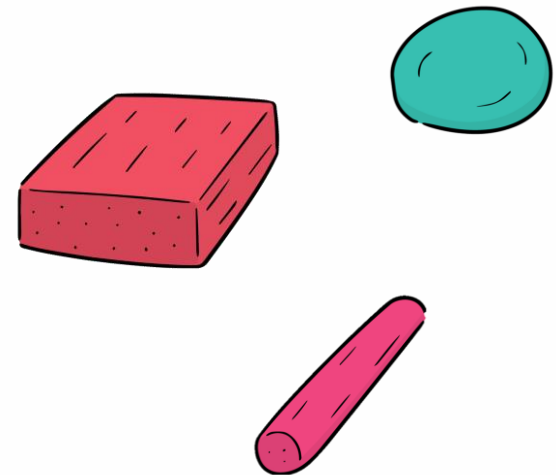
