MATHS:

Our units this term are

Number – Multiplication and Division

We will be learning the formal methods of multiplying and dividing two digit numbers by one digit numbers

Statistics

We will interpret and create bar charts and pictograms

GEOGRAPHY:

We will be learning about maps. Starting locally, we will look at our local area then branch out across the UK before having a look at our closest European neighbors. A list of the skills we will learn is available

KIRES

- The 4 points of the compass are North, South, East and West
- A key uses symbols to mark features on a map.
- The equator is an imaginary line that goes around the middle of the globe.
- The half of the globe north of the equator is called the Northern Hemisphere.
- The half of the globe south of the equator is called the Southern Hemisphere.

ENGLISH:

We will focus on two writing genres this half term, Quest Stories and Shape Poetry. Our Quest stories will be based island adventures inspired by the Rambling Isles in Oliver and the Seawigs. Our shape poems will be inspired by our UK geography focus. (For example, poems about England in the shape of England.) In grammar, we will look at the function of verbs in sentences and examine the possessive apostrophe.

PSHE:

Our theme this term is "Think Positive" and will involve looking at what a growth mindset is and how to achieve one.

ART:

We will produce a layered picture of large British cities. We will also work on printmaking.

PE:

In P.E. will continue our focus on invasion games and developing throwing, catching and movement skills.

Music:

The Learning is based on the song "Three Little Birds" and will involve the children learning about Reggae music including playing instrumental parts with up to three notes. A list of skills can be found here

French:

We will continue to learn new vocabulary.

RE:

This half term in R.E. we will focus on the Christian story of Noah and the idea of Covenant. We will make links between promises in the story of Noah and promises that Christians make at a wedding ceremony. We will also explore links between the story of Noah and how we live in school and the wider world.

SCIENCE:

In science this half term we will discover the different types of rocks and how they are formed. Children will compare and group rocks based on appearance and simple properties. They will learn how fossils are formed and learn about the contribution of Mary Anning to the field of paleontology. Children will also investigate the permeability of different types of soil.
