MATHS:

Our units this half term are multiplication and division, measurement: area, fractions and decimals. A detailed breakdown of the learning objectives we will cover this half term (Spring 1) can be found <u>he.</u>



The 4 points of the compass are North, South, East and West A key uses symbols to mark features on a map. The equator is an imaginary line that goes around the middle of the globe. The half of the globe north of the equator is called the Northern Hemisphere. The half of the globe south of the equator is called the Southern Hemisphere.

ENGLISH:

We will work on two writing genres this half term: fantasy stories and information texts. In our reading lessons, we will continue to focus on the discrete reading skills: vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieval (VIPERS).

SCIENCE:

We will be studying 'States of matter', with a particular focus on different materials and their properties.

ART:

GEOGRAPHY:

We will make a collaborative collage of a map of Truro based on artist Clair Rossiter. We will have a particular focus on use of textures.

PE:

We will continue our work with Mr. Cotterill on 'invasion games' and build on the discreet skills we learnt last term that are required in team sports such as netball, tag rugby, basketball and football.

PSHE:

'Safety First' In this unit of work, children will consider what it means to take responsibility for their own safety. They will learn about everyday risks, hazards and dangers and what to do in risky or dangerous situations. They will also learn about road, water and rail safety and dangerous substances: drugs (including medicines), cigarettes and alcohol. Children will look at first aid, exploring how to deal with common injuries and what to do to respond to emergency situations.

MUSIC:

All the learning is focused around one song: Stop! - a rap/song about bullying. We will be learning about the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and composing.

FRENCH:


We will continue our learning of basic French vocabulary and phrases.
