Structure of the visit

- Review up to 4 exercise books from years 1 to 6
- In most cases the books were selected by the class teacher & included pupils of low, middle and high attainment and SEND, if appropriate

Principles to be explored

- Is the work set at the right level?
- Has progress been made since the beginning of the year?
- · Evidence of problem solving and reasoning
- Quality of presentation of pupils' work
- Is the marking policy being followed?
- Correction of errors/spelling
- Pupils' attitude/response to their work

Summary to be entered on Governor Monitoring Plan:

1. Key points

- a. Wide range of resources in many books indicating careful lesson planning
- b. Pupils are meeting age-appropriate objectives
- c. Evidence of reasoning and problem-solving activities in all years with challenging problems for more able pupils
- d. In some books explanations to demonstrate reasoning skills are clear, but in others they are too vague
- e. Presentation of work in books was generally good and most pieces of work had clear titles & dates
- f. Books were marked up to date in accordance with marking policy but red mushrooms indicating misconceptions were not annotated in all books
- g. Corrections of misspellings needs to be more consistent
- h. Errors in calculations were not highlighted in all books
- i. In some books pupils commented on their attitude to the learning in the lesson

2. Next steps - who and when by

- a. CG to give general feedback at the next staff meeting
- b. WV to meet with small groups of pupils from years 2, 4 and 6 before the end of term to listen to their opinions of the teaching of maths and of their own learning

3. Impact of governance

- a. Monitors the implementation of the School Development Plan
- b. Gains assurance that school leaders are aware of the strengths and weaknesses in the teaching of maths across the school
