Message from Mrs Hunkin

Thinking back to September and the start of the school year, it feels like such a long time ago—and yet, as ever, the months have sped by, and here we are, nearly at the end of year. It definitely wasn't the year we expected and I'd like to thank children and parents for working so hard on their home learning in the spring term. The return to school by children in March was a huge relief to us all and there has been a really purposeful working atmosphere through the school since then. It has been great to see good progress made by so many children in such a short a period of time. We have nearly finished writing school reports; they will be sent out at the end of this week or early next week - as soon as each class set are ready to go.

Next week, we will stick with all our current routines (staggered starts/ends of the day, staggered breaks and lunches and not crossing bubbles.) Although government Covid rules are set to change next week, I am keen to minimise the risk of groups of children or staff needing to self-isolate, particularly this close to the summer holidays.

However, in September, we are hoping to revert to much more normality. Each class will start at 8.55am and finish at 3.30 and we will go back to our specialised afternoon timetables for Key Stage 2 classes. We will aim for Wake and Shake to take place on the playground just before the start of the day.

Following the success of this term, we will stick with children wearing their PE kits for the whole day on their PE days. (PE days will be published in September). For PE, we expect children to wear plain green or black shorts and a white or house coloured tee-shirt. On colder days they are welcome to wear leggings or tracksuit bottoms in plain black, dark grey or bottle green and either their red PE hoodie or green school jumper (not tops or leggings with football team or other logos please.) Children will be also be able to wear their normal PE kit for the whole day if they have an after school sports club.

Year 6 will be having a leavers' assembly on the school field next Tuesday. They have been an amazing group of children and we all wish them every success as they move on to their secondary schools. We are also saying goodbye and huge thanks to Mrs Marley, Mrs Baker and Mrs Samuels who have been teaching to cover maternity leave this year. They have all been outstanding colleagues, absolutely giving their all and we with them all the best in the future. We wish Mrs Lawry much happiness as she gets married next weekend.

Huge thanks to all the staff for their hard work this year and also to the governors for their support and to Kea School Friends who have worked so hard to raise money for the school. I hope you all have a good summer.

A big thank you to Kea School Friends for funding the transport and to the parent








helpers who gave up their day to accompany us.
